POSITION AT NEWBRIDGE.

A meeting of railwaymen of the Newbridge section, County Kildare, was held at the offices of the Irish Transport Workers' Union at Newbridge on Wednesday morning. Twenty men were present, and it was unanimously decided to continue the strike in sympathy with the Kingsbridge men. It was stated that all the railwaymen from Newbridge to Kingsbridge are at present on strike. Pickets were appointed for the station at Newbridge, while arrangements were also made in connection with the Sallins and Naas centre.

A number of applications were received by the Committee from farmers and others for the removal of goods from Newbridge Station, but they were refused, with the exception of one case where it was stated that the goods which were of a perishable nature, had been lying at the railway station some little time before the strike commenced.
